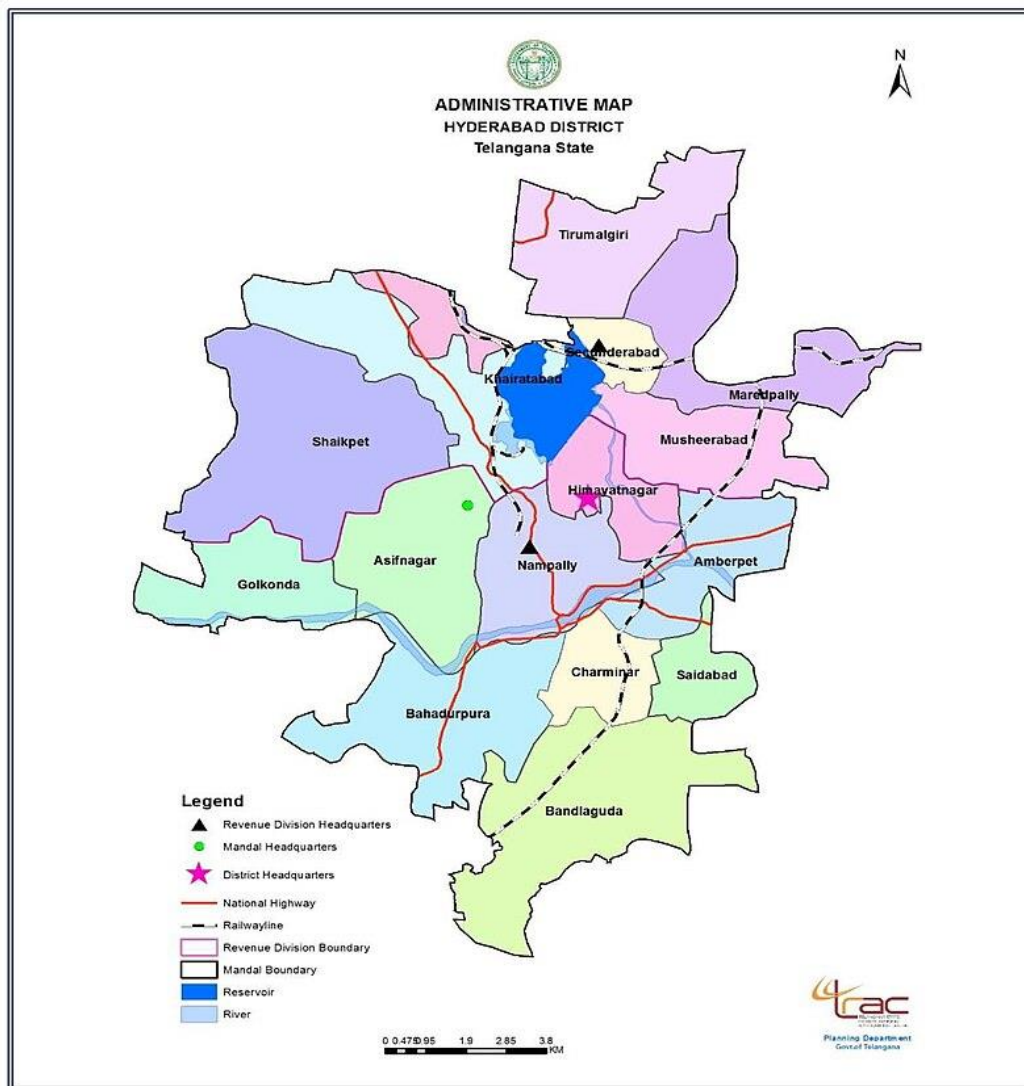

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District Profile-Hyderabad

About District:

Hyderabad (Urban) District in its present shape has come into existence in August, 1978 consequent on formation of a new District, Ranga Reddy from the erstwhile Hyderabad District. All the rural areas of erst-while Hyderabad District have been included in Ranga Reddy District, while the area of Municipal Corporation of Hyderabad (Excloding a small part), Secunderabad Cantonment, Lalaguda and Osmania University are included in Hyderabad District.

Hyderabad is the capital of one of the most techno savvy state in India, T elangana. The previous name of this city was Bagyanagaram. This city is also called the 'city of pearls' because of the major dealing of pearls that is done from this part of the state. Hyderabad was founded in 1591 and planned as a grid with the Charminar at its centre. It has now grown well beyond the confines of the original walled city, to include a new town north of the Musi river, the Military Cantonment at Secunderabad and a burgeoning high-tech Estate, nicknamed "Cyberabad".

The State capital being in this District, it is highly developed in all aspects. With a view to bringing up the administration to the door steps of the people to solve their problems upliftment of the people, the Government as a policy took a decision to restructure the Lower level administrative set-up in the state consequently, Revenue Mandal were setup.

Hyderabad District is a city-district in the state of Telangana which includes a part of the metropolitan capital city area of Hyderabad. It is the smallest in terms of area, among all the districts in the state, but has the highest human density. In the year 1978, Hyderabad district was split into Hyderabad Urban District and Hyderabad Rural. Currently, Hyderabad Urban district is known as the Hyderabad district.

Landscape:

Topography & Terrain:

Location & Area: Hyderabad district spans approximately 217 km², forming part of the Deccan Plateau.

Elevation: The average altitude is around 536 m (1,778 ft) above sea level, with Banjara Hills marking the highest point at roughly 672 m (2,205 ft).

Terrain: Characterized by sloping, rocky landscapes composed of ancient grey and pink granites, with small hillocks scattered across. These granite formations are among the oldest in the world and form part of the Deccan Shield

Water Bodies:

Rivers: The Musi River, a tributary of the Krishna, cuts through the city, creating a central trough that influences drainage patterns.

Lakes and Tanks: Hyderabad is renowned for its numerous lakes (“sagar”) and water tanks. Highlights include:

- Hussain Sagar (built in 1562) at the city’s heart.
- Osman Sagar and Himayat Sagar, artificial reservoirs created on the Musi River.
- As of 1996, there were approximately 140 lakes and 834 water tanks in and around the city.
- Khajaguda Lake and adjacent Khajaguda Hills (Fakhruddin Gutta) serve as popular spots for hiking and bouldering.

Population (Census 2011 – latest official district-level data):

- Total population: 39,43,323 (~3.94 million / 39.43 lakhs)
- Males: 20,18,575
- Females: 19,24,748
- Urban population: 100% (Hyderabad district has no rural population recorded in 2011)

Literacy rate (Census 2011 – latest official district data):

- Overall literacy rate: 83.25%
- Male literacy: 86.99%
- Female literacy: 79.35%
- This makes Hyderabad one of the most literate districts in Telangana, much higher than the state average of ~66.5% in 2011.

Weather and Climatology:

Climate & Rainfall

- **Climate Type:** Hyderabad experiences a tropical wet and dry climate, bordering on hot semi-arid
- **Seasons:**
 - **Summer (March–June):** Hot and dry, average highs in the mid-to-high 30s °C, often surpassing 40 °C.
 - **Winter (December–January):** Cooler nights around 10–14 °C.
- **Rainfall:**
 - Most rain arrives with the south-west monsoon (June–September).
 - Annual rainfall ranges around 828 mm with about 64 rainy days annually.

Languages Spoken: Urdu, Hindi, Telugu and English.

Cultural Identity:

- Hyderabad is called the “City of Pearls” and the “Gateway to South India”, known for its historic fusion of Deccani, Telugu, Mughal, Persian, and European influences.
- It reflects a cosmopolitan culture – deeply traditional yet modern, blending old-world charm with IT-driven urban lifestyles.

Traditions & Festivals:

- **Hindu Festivals:** Bonalu (state festival of Telangana, with roots in Hyderabad), Bathukamma, Diwali, Dussehra, Sankranti.
- **Muslim Festivals:** Ramzan (major highlight – Charminar & Old City markets are famous), Eid-ul-Fitr, Eid-ul-Adha.
- **Christian & Other Festivals:** Christmas, Ganesh Chaturthi, Muharram (notably observed with processions in Old City).
- A unique **Hyderabadi tradition** is the **Ganga-Jamuni Tehzeeb** (co-existence of Hindu & Muslim cultural practices).

Food & Cuisine:

- Globally famous **Hyderabadi Biryani** (blend of Mughlai & Telugu flavors).
- Other signature dishes: Haleem (especially during Ramzan, GI-tagged), Pathar-ka-Gosht, Nihari, Irani Chai, Osmania Biscuits, Double-ka-Meetha.
- Street food and Irani cafés remain central to lifestyle.

Lifestyle

- **Urban modern lifestyle** with malls, IT hubs, metro culture.
- **Old City lifestyle:** Traditional bazaars (Laad Bazaar, Begum Bazaar), heritage houses, pearl and bangle trade.
- **Clothing:**
 - Traditional: Sarees, Salwar Kameez, Sherwanis, Kurtas.
 - Modern: Western wear, corporate attire (especially in IT/education sectors).

Tourism:

Hyderabad district is home to several iconic tourist spots that reflect its rich heritage and vibrant culture. Key attractions include Charminar, Golconda Fort, Chowmahalla Palace, Falaknuma Palace, Qutb Shahi Tombs, Mecca Masjid, and Salar Jung Museum. Modern and

recreational sites such as Ramoji Film City, Hussain Sagar Lake with the Buddha statue, Osman Sagar, KBR National Park, Lumbini Park, Nehru Zoological Park, and Shilparamam also draw visitors. Spiritual sites like Birla Mandir and Jagannath Temple add to the district's appeal, making Hyderabad a diverse and prominent tourism destination.

Hyderabad Economic profile

Economic Output & Per Capita Income

Gross District Domestic Product at Current Prices for Telangana's Districts (2022-23 FRE): In FY 2022–23, Hyderabad district contributed approximately ₹2.28 lakh crore to Telangana's economy, making it the second-largest contributor after Rangareddy (~₹2.83 lakh crore) □

Per-Capita Income (PCI) at Current Prices for Telangana's Districts (2022-23 FRE) : As of 2022–23), Hyderabad had a PCI of around ₹4,94,033 — second only to Rangareddy's ₹9,46,862.

Employment:

Labour Force Participation Rate (LFPR): LFPR measures the percentage of the adult, working-age population (between 15 and 59 years of age) that is either employed or looking for employment.

Urban (Hyderabad district): 48.8% (488 per 1000 persons)

Worker Population Ratio (WPR): The WPR measures the percentage of people employed in the population. A high and growing WPR implies that the economy is producing jobs that match the skills and needs of the population

Urban (Hyderabad district): 44.2% (442 per 1000 persons)

Unemployment Rate (UR) – the share of labor force that's unemployed:

Urban (Hyderabad district): 9.5% (95 per 1000 persons)

Employment in the Major Sectors of the Economy:

Services dominate the employment landscape—driven by IT, trade, real estate, hospitality, transport, and other professional services. IT/ITES is a standout employment driver, with Hyderabad housing the bulk of these jobs. Manufacturing and construction provide significant job opportunities but lag behind services. Agriculture plays virtually no role in employment within Hyderabad district.

Agriculture:

Extremely limited cultivation: Only about 0.6% of Hyderabad district's geographical area (199.6 sq km) is used as net sown area for crop production. The terrain is predominantly rocky, and nearly 80% of the land is devoted to non-agricultural purposes (urban

development, infrastructure, etc.) .Consequently, agriculture in Hyderabad is highly marginal and confined to small pockets — primarily horticultural produce and vegetables.

Horticulture:

Horticultural activity occurs in very localized pockets.

Vegetables: Primary produce includes **brinjal (eggplant)** and **cabbage**.

Fruits: Small-scale fruit cultivation includes **guava** and **grapes**.

College of Horticulture, Rajendranagar: Part of the Sri Konda Laxman Telangana State Horticultural University (SKLTSHU), this college hosts departments for Vegetable Science, Fruit Science, and Floriculture, supported by greenhouses, polyhouses, and instructional farmland.

Fisheries:

Hyderabad district, being predominantly urban, is *not* a significant producer of fish or aquaculture products; its fisheries contributions are administrative, infrastructural, and market-oriented rather than production-based.

Hyderabad hosts the **Telangana State Fishermen Cooperative Societies Federation (TSFCOF)** — the apex body for fisheries cooperatives at the state level. This federation is responsible for marketing, procurement, inputs supply (e.g., nets, gear), processing, and training services for fishers across the state.

Minerals:

Hyderabad district itself plays no direct role in mineral extraction or large-scale mineral production due to its primarily urban character and lack of mining infrastructure. However, it holds strategic importance as a center for exploration research (via AMD) and is becoming a focal point for emerging critical mineral processing—notably in high-tech manufacturing like rare-earth magnet production.

Education:

Hyderabad boasts a diverse and dense network of educational institutions—from primary schools to universities. Hyderabad district stands out as an educational powerhouse—offering depth across primary to doctoral learning, with ongoing shifts toward innovation, employability, and flexibility, serving a vast and growing student population. Prominent universities include Osmania University (OU), Jawaharlal Nehru Technological University, Hyderabad (JNTUH), University of Hyderabad, Maulana Azad National Urdu University (MANUU), DR. B.R. Ambedkar Open University, IIIT Hyderabad, NALSAR University of Law, IIT Hyderabad, NIPER Hyderabad, TIFR, ISB, BITS Pilani – Hyderabad Campus, TISS Hyderabad, Woxsen, Mahindra University, Anurag University, among others.

Energy:

Hyderabad's power needs are met through a hybrid model of state-generated electricity, central sector contributions, private/captive generation, and an expanding renewable energy base—managed by a sophisticated distribution network to ensure reliability for residential, commercial, and industrial users.

There are about 29 Nos of 33/11 KV substations, 3 nos. of 132/33 KV substations, one no. of 66/33 KV and another one 132/66 KV substations are existing in the city at various places. Adequate power supply without any power cuts / power failures is assured for SSI / Tiny Units in the district.

Telecommunications:

Hyderabad district has a highly developed and integrated telecommunications network, supporting urban residents, industrial clusters, IT/ITeS companies, and smart city services, with modern 5G and fiber broadband infrastructure positioning it as a digital hub of southern India.

Water Resources:

Hyderabad's water resources are a complex network of surface water bodies, groundwater reserves, and extensive infrastructure systems that collectively support the city's drinking water, irrigation, and industrial needs. The Hyderabad Metropolitan Water Supply and Sewerage Board (HMWS&SB) is the primary agency responsible for managing these resources.

Major Surface Water Sources

SingurDam

Located on the Manjira River, Singur Dam is a significant source of drinking water for Hyderabad. The reservoir has a live storage capacity of 29 TMC (thousand million cubic feet) and supplies nearly 10 TMC of water to the city. It plays a crucial role in meeting the city's water demands.

OsmanSagar(Gandipet)

Built in 1921, Osman Sagar is located near Gandipet and serves as a vital reservoir for Hyderabad. It has a total capacity of 3.9 TMC, though reduced due to silt accumulation. The reservoir's catchment area spans approximately 738 km².

NizamsagarDam

Constructed in 1931 across the Manjira River, Nizamsagar Dam is situated about 144 km northwest of Hyderabad. With a storage capacity of 25.6 TMC, it contributes to both irrigation and drinking water supply.

Logistics & Freight Corridors:

Outer Ring Road & NHs facilitate truck and logistics movement, bypassing congested city areas. Jawaharlal Nehru Port (JNPT) cargo routes and inter-district freight corridors pass via Hyderabad.

Road Transport:

Hyderabad district has a comprehensive road network combining national highways, state highways, ring roads, and urban arterial roads, supporting efficient passenger travel, industrial logistics, and IT corridor connectivity, with ongoing upgrades under smart city and metro integration projects.

Rail Transport:

Hyderabad district has a well-developed rail network supporting long-distance passenger travel, suburban commuting, and freight movement, with ongoing expansions to integrate urban rail (MMTS) and metro corridors for better connectivity.

- Secunderabad & Hyderabad Deccan stations handle significant freight movement, connecting to:
- Logistics hubs
- Industrial zones like Patancheru (pharma & chemicals) Outer Ring Road (via freight sidings and cargo terminals)
- Rail freight primarily carries coal, cement, pharmaceuticals, and containerized goods.

Air Transport:

Hyderabad district's air network is highly advanced, with RGIA serving as a key international and domestic hub, supporting passenger traffic, logistics, and cargo operations, while ongoing expansion projects ensure future capacity growth and sustainability.

Hyderabad Industrial Scenario

Heavy Industries & Public Enterprises: Hyderabad hosts numerous premier enterprises like BHEL, NFC, NMDC, BEL, ECIL, DRDO, HAL, CCMB, CDFD, and major banking institutions.

Sectoral Contribution:**Information Technology:**

- Hyderabad is a major IT export hub, accounting for ₹2.41 lakh crore (~US\$ 32 billion) in FY 2022–23, and holds about 50% of Telangana's IT export share.
- The district is home to HITEC City, aka Cyberabad—a sprawling tech enclave that houses global tech giants and supports over 9 lakh IT/ITES employees across 1,500+ firms

Pharmaceuticals & Biotechnology:

- Hyderabad is often referred to as the “Pharmacy Capital of India,” contributing around 20% of the nation's drug production.
- The Genome Valley (in Medchal – Malkajgiri district adjacent to Hyderabad) is a key life sciences hub, supporting research, manufacturing, and attracting significant investments.
- Hyderabad Pharma City, though in Ranga Reddy, is a massive industrial park projected to generate USD 9.7 billion in investment and employ about 560,000 people

Diversified Services & Manufacturing :

Hyderabad's economy blends traditional manufacturing (e.g., defense, auto components, and textiles) with modern services (finance, tourism, retail, real estate) that outperform IT in terms of employment

Startup & Innovation Ecosystem

- Hyderabad is rapidly emerging as a startup hub, especially in healthcare booking and HRTech sectors, expanding its tech profile beyond traditional IT.
- The government-backed T-Hub incubation center has supported over 2,000 startups since 2015, which collectively raised around US\$ 2 billion

The city is renowned for crafting intricate jewellery adorned with precious gemstones such as rubies, emeralds, sapphires, and pearls. This specialization has garnered attention from industry bodies like the Gem & Jewellery Export Promotion Council (GJEPC) and EXIM Bank, who have conducted assessments to identify and address challenges hindering the growth of this cluster. Approximately 3500 units of different sizes including artisans, tiny and job works are involved in this activity of Studded Gold Jewellery with approximately 1,00,000 people involved in this profession.
